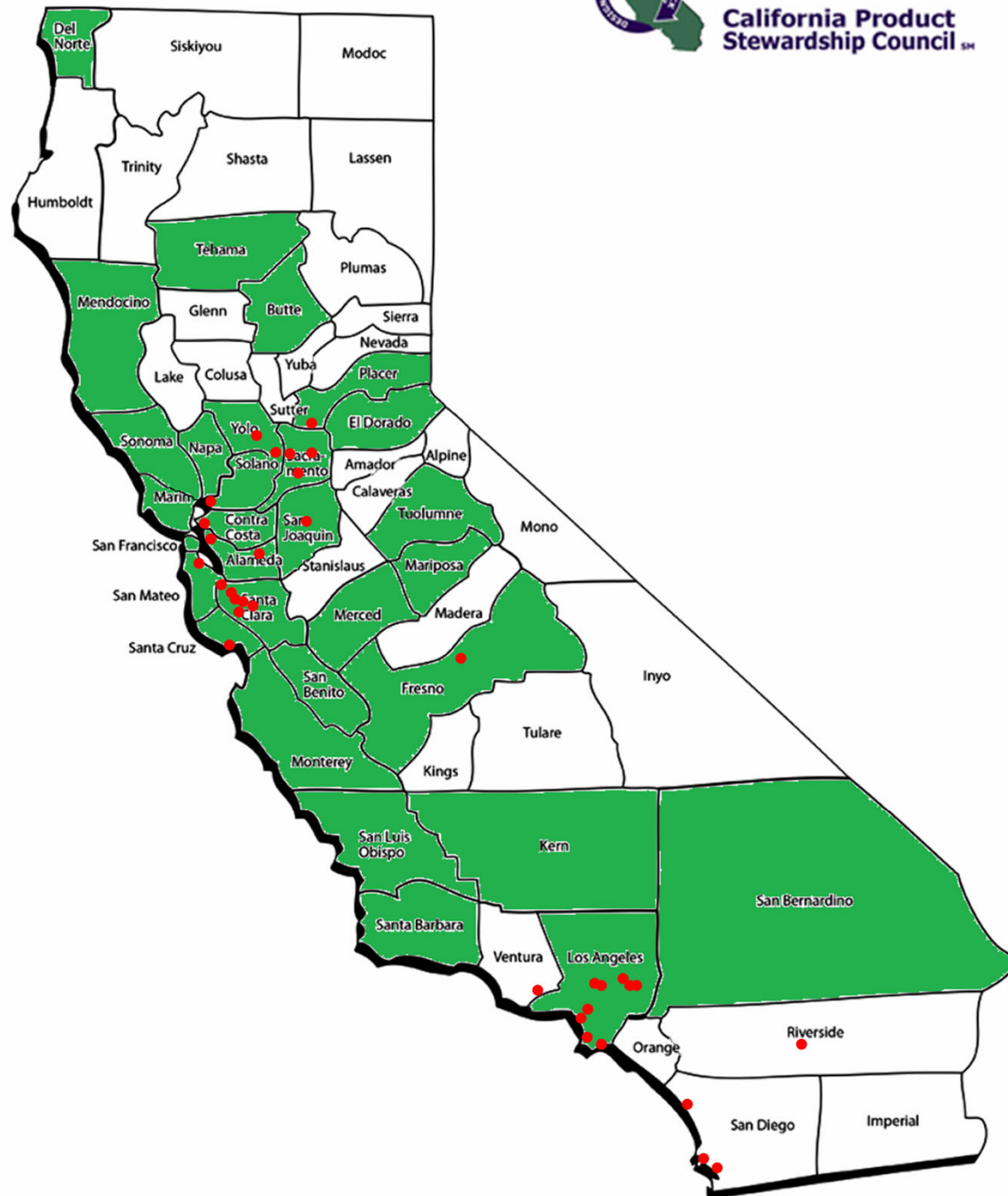

Update of what's new in the Capitol?

2021-2022 Legislative Session

Year 1:

AB 1 – AB 2963

SB 1 – SB 1493

(Doesn't include Resolutions, etc.)

Illegal Dumping Related (2021):

- AB 246 (Quirk) – **Signed!**
- AB 483 (Jones-Sawyer) – **Signed!**
- AB 659 (Mathis) – **Died!**



2021-2022 Legislative Session (Cont'd)

Year 2:

AB 1594 – AB 2963

SB 829 – SB 1493

(Doesn't include Resolutions, etc.)

Illegal Dumping or Litter Related (2022):

- AB 1690 (Rivas) - Prohibit sale of a cigarette utilizing a single-use filter made of any material, an attachable and single-use plastic device meant to facilitate manual manipulation or filtration of a tobacco product, or a single-use electronic cigarette or vaporizer device.
- AB 2374 (Bauer-Kahan) – Would increase the maximum fine for the dumping of commercial quantities of waste from \$3000 to \$5000 for the first conviction, from \$6000 to \$10,000 for the second conviction, and from \$10,000 to \$20,000 for the third and any subsequent convictions.

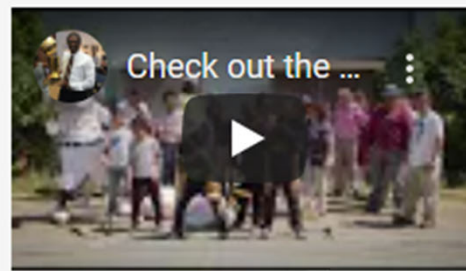
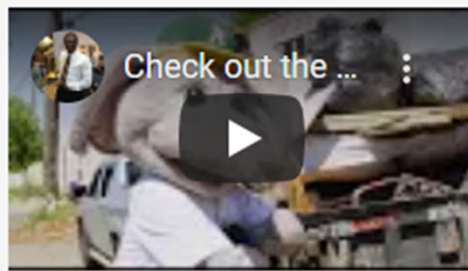

Background

The Illegal Dumping Technical Advisory Committee (IDTAC) provides ongoing expertise for CalRecycle and the state of California, is comprised of voluntary members, and is not required to function under the statutory requirements of a legislative or department-created committee. Started as a [Task Force in 2006](#), the group evolved into today's technical advisory committee and relative subcommittees given the long-term problems associated with illegal dumping. The IDTAC continues to assess the extent and cost of the illegal dumping, while sharing their findings, best practices, and strategies in the [Illegal Dumping Resources Toolbox](#).

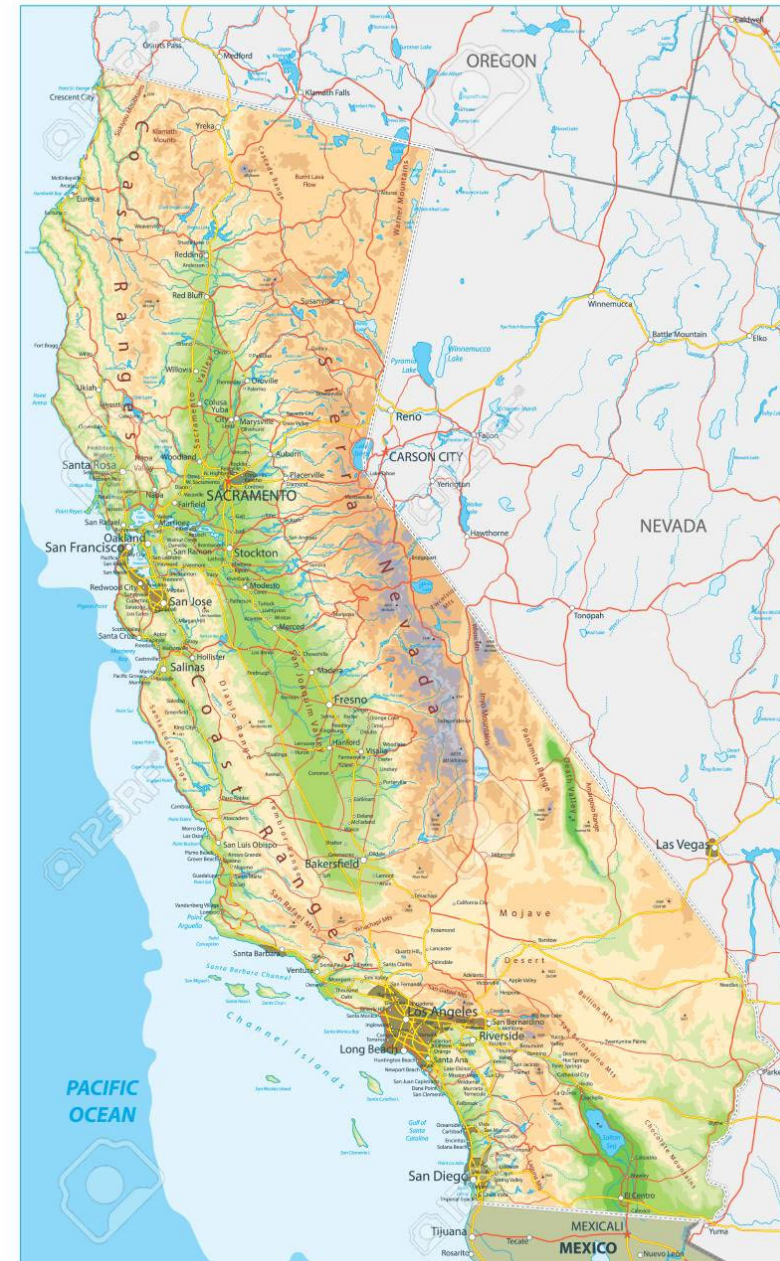
